

Calendar for Village Elections

March 20, 2007

- Jan. 2 First day to sign independent nominating petitions.
- Jan. 9-16 First day to publish party caucus notice in newspaper (not earlier than 2 weeks prior to caucus) depending on date of caucus.
- Jan. 13-20 Last date to post and file in office of village clerk AND the Board of Elections, notice of party caucus, depending on date of caucus. (At least 10 days before caucus.)
- Jan. 13-20 Last day to post notice of party caucus in (6) six public places depending on date of caucus.
- or -
- Jan. 16-23 Last day to publish notice of party caucus in newspaper, depending on date of Caucus.
- Jan. 23-30 Dates for holding party caucus.
- Feb. 1 Last day for filing certificate of party nomination.
- Feb. 5 Last day to file certificate of acceptance or declination of party nomination.
- Feb. 6-13 Dates for filing independent nominating petitions.
- Feb. 7 Last day to fill vacancy caused by declination of party nomination.
- Feb. 16 Last day to file certificate of acceptance or declination of an independent nomination.
- Feb. 16 Dates for filing statements of receipts and expenses
Mar. 9 for village elections, as per New York State Board
Apr. 16 of Elections Rules and Regulations.
- Feb. 20 Last day to file certificate filling vacancy in an independent nomination.
- Mar. 9 Last day for voter to register with Board of Elections to vote in village election.

- Mar. 13 Last day for Board of Elections to receive application for an absentee ballot to be mailed to a voter.
- Mar. 16 Last day to open voting machines for inspection by candidates or representatives.
- Mar. 19 Last day for applicant (or his agent) to personally deliver application for an absentee ballot to the Board of Elections.
- Mar. 20 Election Day. Polls open Noon to 9 p.m.**
- Mar. 27 Last day for Board of Elections to complete canvass of village elections conducted by the Board of Elections.

POLITICAL CALENDAR VILLAGE ELECTIONS

Registration by Mail -- Forms for Registration by mail may be obtained at the following offices: Board of Elections, Town Clerk, Village Clerk, Chamber of Commerce, Dept. of Motor Vehicles and other State Agencies providing services to the public.

Absentee Voting -- Civilians may qualify to vote by absentee ballot if their duties, occupation, or business requires them to be away from their county of residence, or if they are on vacation on the day of any Village Election. (Including spouse, parent or child accompanying such person).

Applications for absentee ballots to be mailed to the voter must be received by the Board of Elections not later than seven days before the election. If the applicant or his agent delivers the application to the Board of Elections in person, such application must be received not later than the day before the election. All absentee ballot envelopes must be postmarked no later than the day before the election.
