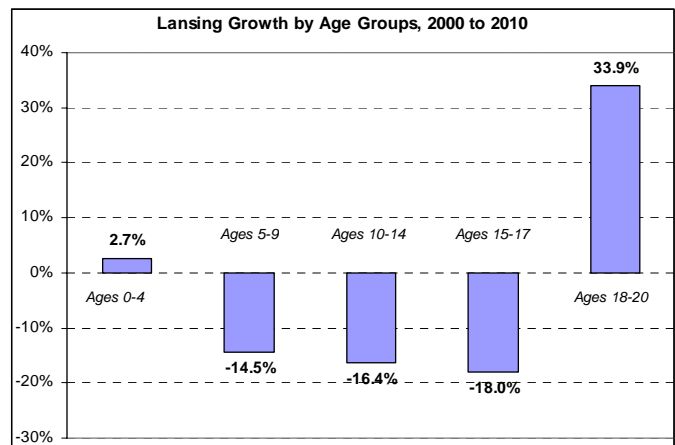

3. Youth Population

The Town of Lansing lost youth population between 2000 and 2010. Age groups 0-4 and 18-20 increased but age groups 5-9, 10-14 and 15-17 are smaller. Lansing's rate of decrease in 0-17 youth from 2000 to 2010 was the third greatest in the County.

Approximately 11% of Tompkins County youth, ages 0-17, live in Lansing.

*A Person in Need of Supervision (PINS) is a youth under the age of eighteen who is showing a pattern of habitual disobedience, running away, curfew violations, substance abuse, violent behavior, or school truancy problems. Pre-PINS Diversion Services attempt to resolve the conflicts that brought a youth to the attention of the Probation Department by offering supervision, guidance, and referrals to community resources, thus preventing the need for formal Family Court intervention. Pre-PINS Diversion is a mandatory prerequisite prior to filing a formal PINS petition in Family Court.
